

## GUIDELINES OF A PROFESSIONAL DRESS CODE

### Suits

- A formal trouser suit, formal dress (worn with a jacket) or skirt suit.
- Suits should be of a formal, business style. A conservative cut; jackets must be worn.
- An **officially recognised tie** (sports colours or sixth form tie) properly knotted at all times
- Formal knitwear, can be worn under a jacket but not as an alternative.
- Short skirts are inappropriate and unacceptable for school.
- Plain tights
- Blouses or shirts must be formal and conservative (no halter necks or spaghetti straps); T-shirts and/or polo shirts are unacceptable.

### Shoes

- Black or brown shoes of a formal appearance with dark socks.

### Hair

- Must look tidy; hair covering the eyes is not permitted.
- Hair accessories must be kept to a minimum.
- Facial hair is permitted, unless in CCF.

### Jewellery and cosmetics

- Jewellery and cosmetics, should be discreet and kept to a minimum. Discreet piercings are permitted.

**Sixth formers should keep to the guideline of a professional dress code as outlined above.**

**Acceptable dress will be at the discretion of the relevant Housemaster/Mistress or the Head and Deputy Heads of Sixth Form**

### Sports Wear

Sixth formers have a wide choice over their sports activities in school and the appropriate clothing must be worn. If selected for teams it may be necessary to purchase some items of the team kit.

**All clothing - uniform and sportswear - must be marked with the owner's name.**
